Essential Understanding:

Art III is designed for the serious minded student of art. Students will develop an avenue for personal expression and style through exposure to various mediums of 2-D and 3-D Art and Design. Emphasis will be placed on inquiry and investigation through practice, experimentation, and revision of artworks. Students will work to develop an understanding of the Elements of Art and Principles of Design and how they work together to create aesthetically pleasing artwork. Students will explore the mediums of drawing, painting, pastel, collage, printmaking, computer generated work, and sculpture. Students will develop their artists' vocabulary to discuss and communicate how they respond to art through self-reflection and art criticism. Career possibilities will be explored in the following areas: commercial art, graphic design, teaching fine art, the history of art, and professional art related fields.

Themes:

1. Applying The Elements of Art & Principles of Design
2. The Gestalt: Aesthetics & Compositional Balance
3. Purpose of Art: Art History; Movements, Time Periods, Styles, Artists
4. Self-Reflection and Art Criticism
5. Social Justice Art (Political, Protest, Propaganda)
6. 2-D & 3-d Art Mediums

Course Objectives and Expectations:

- Students will develop plans for creating art and designing works using various materials and methods from traditional and contemporary practices.
- Students will create art or design projects in response to contemporary issues demonstrating an awareness of ethical implications of making and distributing creative works.
- Students will complete artworks or designs incorporating relevant criteria as well as personal artistic vision.
- Students will apply appropriate methods or processes to display artwork in a specific place.

- Students will analyze an exhibit or collection's impact on personal awareness of social, cultural, or political beliefs and understandings.
- Students will evaluate the effectiveness of an artwork as perceived by a variety of audiences.
- Students will defend an interpretation of an artwork or collections of artworks.
- Students will analyze a collection of artwork based on sets of criteria.
- Students will incorporate knowledge of personal, social, cultural, and historical life to create artworks.
- Students will compare uses of art in a variety of personal, societal, cultural, and historical contexts.
