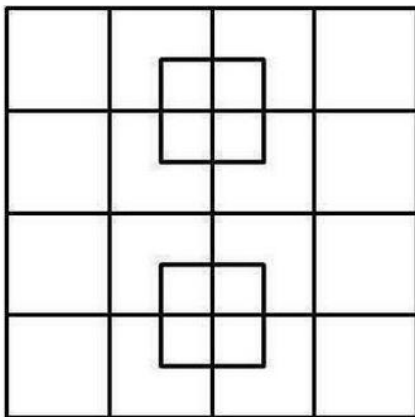


Supaman

Megan: What does it feel like to be one of the new teachers?

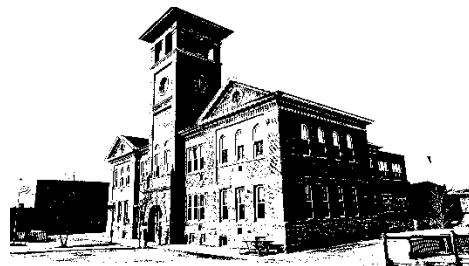
